The last Will and Testament of Samuel Rumphap, of the name of God Amen. I Samuel Rumphap of Orange County and Province of North Carolina, being sick and weak, but of sound mind and memory, and calling unto mine that it is appointed for all men once to die; do make and order in this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Rumphap, One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, at the lower end of my Tract, including my dwelling house and Plantation whereon I now live, together with all the Rumphap household belonging. Also my Negroes & to wit, Sam, Peter, and Kate with all my Stock and household, furniture of every kind, for and during the Term of her natural life or Widowhood.

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved son Robert Rumphap One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, at the upper end of my Tract, whereon I now live, running East and West, when he shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved son Nathaniel Rumphap One Hundred and fifty Acres of Land, being his Brother's Robert's, running East and West, at the age of Twenty one years, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved son John Rumphap, Two hundred Acres of Land, being his Brother's Nathaniel's running East and West at the age of Twenty one years, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and Bequeath unto my beloved son Samuel Rumphap, One hundred and fifty Acres of Land including the Plantation and Rumphap household, already given to my Wife Mary Rumphap.

Item. My Will and desire is that after the death or marriage of my wife Mary Rumphap that my Negroes with their Increase, together with all my household furniture, and Stock of every kind shall be equally divided, among my children, to wit, Robert Rumphap, Nathaniel Rumphap, John Rumphap, Mary Rumphap, Elizabeth Rumphap, Mary Rumphap, And as I have reason to believe my wife is now child, and should it live with my other Children to the age of Twenty years, that then my Negroes together with all my personal Estate, be equally divided to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Mary Rumphap, Executrix together with my faithful friends William Washington and Daniel Parry Executors of this my last Will & Testament and do hereby disannul all other wills by me made heretofore. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of September 1773.

 former Wills and points made by me and acknowledging this to be my

#5 John Moore's Will

In the name of God Amen. This twentieth day of September in the
 year of our late, one Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy Six, I John Moore of
 the County of Orange and Province of North Carolina, being in a weak and
 feeble state of health, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to almighty God,
 reflecting on the mortality of my body and uncertainty when I
 shall be called to account, and appoint this to be my Last Will & Testament,

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and as for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with I dispose
 of them in the following manner and form. I do first Recommend my Soul into
 the hands of God who gave it me and my body to the dust to be decently buried by
 my Executors hereafter mentioned, not doubting but I shall receive there a reward
 at the Resurrection and Last day.

Imprimis. I Give and Bequeath to my son Joseph Moore, who is my heir
 at law, Ten Negro Slaves Viz. Tom and Billy. Item. I Give and Bequeath
 to my son Joseph Moore, two Daughters, viz. Nancy and Sarah, Forty pounds
 Virginia Money each, for to Purchase them a Negro Girl each.
 Item. I Give and Bequeath to my son John Moore Thirteen Negroes Viz. And,
 John and Malaga, also one white man and thirty pounds Virginia Money
 to pay for the Land he has purchased. Item. I Give and Bequeath unto my
 Grandson John Moore (son of John) One Negro Boy named Phill, also I Give
 and Bequeath to my Grandson, (not Christened but called) Patrick Henry Moore
 son of John, one Negro Boy named Ball. Item. I Give and Bequeath
 to my Daughter Sarah Thirteen Negroes Viz. Hannah, Samuel & Agnes.
 Item. I Give and Bequeath to my Grandson John Moore Thirteen Negroes, and the
 young girl (Daughter of Hannah) named Sarah. Item. I Give and Bequeath
 unto my Daughters Elizabeth and Ann, ten pounds Virginia Money
 also I Give to my said Daughter Elizabeth, two Negroes, viz. Dick and
 Jody and fifty pounds Virginia Money to Purchase a Negro Girl for
 her children, at the discretion of my Executors. But be it Enacted, and it is
 my sense that it has said Elizabeth Moore had do die and leave no
 issue behind her that then both the Negroes, and money lent to her should
 be equally divided among the rest of my children. Item. I Give and
 Bequeath to my Daughter James Stewart, One Negro, named
 Gloucester. Also I Give to my said Daughter James's Wife
