 it me and my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be
 Decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named
 and Teaching that My Body shall where with it shall be placed
 in his special Goodness to Rest on me I Give and Bequeath in
 Manner and form following I Give my will and Desire is
 that my Loving Wife Martha have the Tent of all my estate
 both Real and Personal During her Natural Life
 And at her Decease to Return to Dudley Gatwood
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Nephew Dudley Gatwood

all my whole estate after the Decease of my wife Martha
 Gatwood to him and his Heirs forever and I do hereby constitute
 and appoint him the said Dudley Gatwood my whole
 and Sole Executor in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of October 1769

 Will and Testament as follows. I Give and Bequeath
 to my Son Daniel Jergent the land I Bought from
 Johna Lying between my own Line of Sabin
 Hafford and John Campbell, containing 133 Acres
 I Give and Bequeath to my Wife Ruth the
 Land I own Lin on and her three Haddle of Cattle bed
 and Furniture I Give and Bequeath to my
 Daughter Elizabeth one Cattle bed & Furniture
 I Give and Bequeath to my Son Daniel a
 Dish of Plates and a Razor, And the other Cattle
 to be Equally Divided between Elizabeth their Mother
 and the other Household Goods to be Equally Divided
 between the Children & their Mother till they keep them
 During her Widowhood or till they come of Age & then
 the Children to have their parts. And I Give my Brother
 Stephen Jergent of South Carolina My Carriage to my Estate
 it being my last will & Testament. whereunto I set my hand
 and seal
