ner and form following First I Order that all my just
debts be paid. Then I Give and lend unto my well beloved
wife Elizabeth Long for the support and raise my Children
upon during her lifetime or widowhood. The Land and plan-
tations which I now live, All the Plantations, tools and har-
rowe furniture Likewise all the Horse Creatures and all my flock
of Cattle and Hogs if Necessity should so require my
Executor hereafter Named may sell and dispose of any part
of my personal Estate at the think can be best spent
for the support of my wife and small Children and at
my wife's Death at a Marriage. I Order that my personal
Estate which I left her be Equally divided Between my
Daughter Elizabeth Long and Francis Long my son Reuben Long
and Daughter Susannah Long, Then to my son John Long
I Give One hundred Acres of Land Joining said Child Hugh Barnard
and Pryor's line, Then to my son James Long I Give One hundred
Acres of Land Joining the land of my son John Long, Truly I
think and the remainder of my land at my wife's Death or Marriage
to be divided between my sons John and Reuben Long, If
having the two half Joining my son James. Likewise to my
son John Long I Give my Blacksmith's tools
Then to my Daughter Ann Eliza I Give Twenty Shillings
Then to my Daughter Mary I Give Twenty Shillings
Then to my Daughter Susan I Give Twenty Shillings
Lastly I do Ordain constitute and Appoint Elizabeth
Long my well beloved wife and Reuben Long to be whole
and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
