In the Name of God Amen. I Benjamin Crocks
of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina being of
sound and perfect mind and memory but very weak in body, bless
be God for his mercies. At this fifth day of September in the year of
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety make and Publish this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form following —
First I Give and recommend my soul to the Almighty God and my
body to the Ground and as touching the worldly things that God has
been please to bless me with, after my just Debt is paid and my
estate decently buried to be disposed of as followeth —

Item I Give and bequeath unto beloved wife Mary the Mansion House I
now live in and one hundred Acres of my Land Including the Improvements
and also the Stock of every kind and the House furniture excepting
such Furniture and Stock as I shall give to my Children during her
life and after her Death my Will and desire that all my land shall
be equally Divided between my four young sons to wit Benjamin,
Reu, John, and Samuel, but if either of the above mentioned sons
namely (Benjamin, Reu, John, or Samuel) should come to age
before the Death of their Mother and should want to settle on the Land
my Will is that they may settle on any part excepting the hundred
Acres I Give to my beloved wife Mary. Item I Give and
bequeath unto my son Benjamin the Horse Collt that came of my
Sister Mary which is named Alice and my Silver Shoe Buckles and
Knobuckles. Item my Will and Desire is that my wife shall
Raise a Collt of each out of the Stock for my son Reu, John,
and Samuel against they come of age. Item I Give to my
(Daughter) Sarah one Feather bed and furniture and a good Cow
and calf and six new pewter plates and one Pewter Dish,
Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Morser one Cow and calf
and no more. Item I Give to my son David one black mare
Named Kate and no more, and as for the share of my son
Andrew

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Andrew Deane, I sent off with one Shilling to each child, and thereby make and Ordain my beloved wife Mary and my son David Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Benjamin Enocks have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand & seal the day and year above written,

And also published and declared by this said Benjamin Enocks the Testator as his last Will and Testament in presence of who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof,
