 Between James Sanders Esq. on behalf of his father James of the Inferior
 Court of the County of Coosum & their successors of the One Part
 & William Huston of the Other Part Witnesseth that the said
 James Sanders Esq. In Pursuance to an Order of the said
 County Court made the 3rd day of March 1783 and according
 to the Direction of said Court Assembly in that case made
 & Provided doth put place and bend unto the said William
 Huston, Anderson Haralson an Orphan Now of the age of
 Seven years & Two Months with the said William Huston to live
 after the Manner of an Apprentice, & servant until he attain
 the age of Twenty one year, during all which Term his said
 Master he faithfully shall serve his Lawfull Commands every
 where Gladly Obedy he shall not at any Time Absent himself
 from his said Master, Service without leave but in all things
 as a good and faithfull behave Towards his said Master
 And the said William Huston doth Covenant Promise
 agree to and with the said James Sanders that he will
 Teach and cause to be Taught and Instructed the said Anderson
 Haralson to Read Wright & Cypher according to Law of this
 Instruct him in the Business of a Planter and that he will
 constantly feed & Provide for the said Apprentice sufficient
 diet Working Lodging and Apparel during the Term aforesaid
 Sufficient for an Apprentice and also all other things necessary
 both in looking for Health In Winter when of the
 Parties to these presents hath Interchangeable set their
 hands & seals the day after first above Written
