Will to my son Francis and my Daughter Ann all my Goods &
Chattels that on Clinch, to be Equally Divided Between them

and after my Just debts being payed, here I Bequeath to
my loving Wife all my Land, Goods and Chattels, during her
Life or Widowhood & then to be Disposed of as follows, to wit,
To my son John half a Dollar, To my son William half a Dollar
To my son Thomas Three Hundred Acres of Land up the
River to be made to him when of age, To my Daughter Mary Three half

a Dollar all my other Land, Goods & Chattels to be Divided equally
Between Catharine, Nathan, Henry, Elizabeth, Susanah, At my
Wife and son Thomas's Discretion, I Witness with my hand
this day of year above Written
