firmly by these presents Sealed with my Seal and Dated this 15th day
of November 1792

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that Whereas
the above Bound John Smith, hath Granted free privilege, freely
Giv^g up and Comitt^d of the said David Mitchell his heirs &c
Cutting Firs out of all kinds such as Pines or Spruce or
Birch on his own line on the North Side of and on the said
Smiths Land. Joining said Mitchell on the South of his Land.
Now if the said John Smith Grants and Giv^g said Mitchell
all the Priviledge on said Land above Described as tho it was
own Land without any Obligation or Lien upon Whatsoever
That then, the above Obligation to be Void of no Effect
Otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue in Law
