 In the name of God Amen, David Vanhook of the
 State of North Carolina, and County of Currituck make this
 my last Will and Testament, I Reize my soul to God
 the Giver as a being infinitely good in hopes of a future
 Happyness. I do my body my desire is it may be buried
 in a Central and Christian like manner, Such is the last
 injunction I have on my Dear ones whose names is as follows
 To wit, I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved
 Spouse Lucy Vanhook, David Vanhook, Hendrick Vanhook
 my Lawfull Son my Executor of this my last Will and
 Testament, The Executor or Executors of this my last Will
 and Testament — I have my beloved Spouse Lucy Vanhook
 Receiveth possession of all my Estate with Personal Goods
 during her widowhood and afterwards to be disposed in the
 following manner, to wit that is to say my son Jacob
 Shall have two tracts of Land, one lying by the name of Poplar
 Springs Tract, and the other which then lately does to Lopp the tract
 whereon I now live, and the other Tract that Lays between
 and Lopping Branches and Rivers, I then Give to my
 Son Hendrick Vanhook, one tract of Land, lyes by the
 name of Banks Tract, and to be valued, and if it falls
 short of Jacobs Tract value, it is to be made up in other
 things to that value, — I then Give to my son David Vanhook
 one Tract of Land lying on the State of South Sea on
 McMinners Blanche, and to be valued, & if it falls short
 of his two Brothers its to be made good & Equal to them —
 I then Give to my son Robert Vanhook the tract of Land
 whereon I live and the Liddy does that comes off Jacobs
 Tract and it is to be valued also and made equal to
 with the rest of his Brothers in value —

I then Give to my Daughter Sarah Vanhook one Negro
 Girl named Pinner, a good Horse, saddle, and Saddle, at the
 full value fifteen pounds, also a leather bed and furniture
 of the Negroes, Indian, Stock and household Furniture
 and plantation Tools to be Equally Divided amongst the
 four Boys, and if any of the above named Children should
 die before Marries or arrive to lawfull age that their Estates
 shall be Equally Divided amongst those of my Children
 that shall be then living, This my last will & Testament
 being read and heard but found in Judgment dated
 this Twenty first day of October in the year of our Lord
 Christ 1781
