 now lives also five chairs one Table to be sold and the Money to be
 equally Divided Between Willis Bucklegham Smith John Smith
 and Keadah Smith Also I leave that Willis Bucklegham Smith
 may live with e Mason Smith with all that he has till he comes
 of age and the said e Mason Smith to keep him and all I have
 left to the said Willis Bucklegham Smith till then and as for the
 Residue of my Estate I Will that it shall be sold by my
 Executors and the money arising from the sale be applied in dis-
 charging the Debts which may be due on the Estate

And Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved Grandson e Mason
 Smith and my trusty friend e Nicholas e Murphy Executors to this
 my last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and deny
 all other Will or Wills by me made and all other Legacies and bequests
 in Writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my seal
