Between Gabriel Dacey Esq in behalf of the Customs and their  
Sweepers of the County of Lincoln of the one part, and  
Philip Thomas of the other part Witnesseth that the said  
Gabriel Dacey Esquire in pursuance to an Order of the  
said County Court made the say and date above written  
and according to the Direction of the Act of our Lord the King  
in such Case made Provided with that below and his date  
the said Philip Thomas, Jacob Robertson an Orphan now  
of the age of eight years the 20th October 1788 with the  
said Philip Thomas to live after the Manner of an apprentice  
and servant until he shall attain to the age of Twenty  
One years during all which time he said Apprentice his said  
Master shall faithfully serve his Lawful Commanding where  
Gladly Obey he shall not at any time abscond himself  
from his said Masters service without leave but in all things  
as a good and faithful servant shall behave towards his said  
Master And the said Philip Thomas with Consent promise  
and agree to and with the said Gabriel Dacey that he will  
teach and instruct or cause to be taught by and instructed  
the said Jacob Robertson to Read Write & Accounting to Law  
and the Art and Mystery of a Carpenter and that he will constantly  
provide for the said Apprentice necessary the Term  
of said sufficient such Washing lodging & Apparel  
fitting for an Apprentice and all other things necessary  
both in Sickness and in health to maintain whereof the parties  
to these presents have Indemnifiedly set their hands &  
Seals the say 21st year forth above written

bind unto the said Moses Steele, Gideon Robertson an Orphan Now  
of the age of Two years last Term with the said Moses Steele  
to live after the manner of an Apprentice & Servant until he  
shall be the age of Twenty One years During all which time  
the said apprentice his said Masters shall faithfully serve his  
Lawful Commands every where Gladly Obedy he shall not  
at any time Absent himself from his said Masters house  
without leave but in all things as a Good & Faithful Slave have  
Towards his said Master And the said Moses Steele with  
Covenant Promise and agree to and with the said Gabriel  
Dauby that he will Teach and Instruct or cause to be Taught  
and Instructed the said Gideon Robertson According to Law  
to read write & cipher also the Art and Mystery of a  
Carpenter and that he will constantly find and provide for the said  
apprentice Sufficient with washing and lodging and apparel  
fitting for an apprentice and Servant during the Term aforesaid  
and also all Other things Necessary both in sickness and in health

time he shall attain to the age of Eighteen years during all which  
time the said Apprentice her said Master shall faithfully  
serve his lawful Commands every where Gladly Obedy  
he shall not at any time Absent himself from her said  
Masters house without leave but in all things as a Good  
and Faithful Servant behave Towards her said Master.  
And the said Billy Hughes with Covenant Promise and  
agree to and with the said John Douglass that he will  
Teach and Instruct and cause to be Taught & Instructed  
the said Minny Simpson According to Law to read  
write & cipher also the art and Mystery of a Carpenter  
and that he will Constantly find and provide for the said  
apprentice during the term aforesaid Sufficient with  
Washing Lodging and apparel fitting for an apprentice  
and all Other things Necessary both in sickness and
