But taking into Consideration the Shortness & Uncertainty of this Transitory Life and that it is appointed for all men Once to die, and being Desirous to settle things in Order, do make Casketable Wills in this my last will and Testament in Manner and form following That is to say, First and Principally I Commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it And my body to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors whom I shall hereafter Nominate and Appoint, and as to such worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life with I Give and Dispose of the same in the following manner I Warrant That is to say my Will and Desire such and lasted that all my Lawful debts be paid, and the remaining part of my Estate to be disposed of as shall be hereafter Expressed & Imprimise, I Give and Bequeath to my dear Son John Barker One Negro Man named Abraham that he has at this time in his Possession —

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son John Barker one half of the Tract of Land whereon I now live, that is known by the name of Ephraim Logans Tract, containing by estimation One Hundred and eighty two Acres, the said Tract to be Divided by one Straight line running East and West, my son John to have the Upper part of said Tract. Also give to my son John one Hundred and Nine Acres of Land, Lying the same taken all of the Tract which I purchased from Richard Oldham, I also give to my son John One Negro Boy named Jack, one Feather Bed and Furniture, Item, I Give and Bequeath to

To my son James Barker One Negro Boy named James and Fifty Pounds in Money — Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son George Barker Two Hundred Acres of Land to be Taken out of the Land I purchased from Richard Oldham on the North Side of the Creek called Harris Tract of Long Creek, And if not land enough on the North side of said Creek to run over on the South side, I will give to my son George Barker one Negro Boy named Daniel — Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son David Barker one Tract of Land which I purchased of Richard Oldham containing One Hundred and fifty Acres, Lying the same County line, known by the name of Matthews Tract. I Also give to my son David fifty Acres of Land Lying the said Matthews Tract, After my son William has his Land run Out that I shall hereafter mention I Also give to my son David Barker one Negro Boy named Aaron and One Feather Bed and Furniture, also one Cow and Calf — Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son William Barker one Half of the Tract of Land whereon I now live, known by the name of Ephraim Logans Tract, containing by estimation One Hundred & eighty two Acres the said Tract to be Divided by one Straight line running East and West, my son William to have the Lower part of said Tract. I also Give to my son William One Hundred and Nine Acres of Land Lying the same to be Taken off of the Tract I purchased of Richard Oldham, I also Give to my son William one Negro man named Moses and one Black Horse, one Feather Bed & Furniture One Cow and Calf — Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Susanah Barker one Negro Woman Named Edy and her Increase One Negro Boy Named David

The receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge And do Manumit and Defend the Title of the said Slave. One and Place to the use himself and his heirs of the said Archibald Murphy his heirs and assigns forever from the Claims or Claims of all and every Person whatsoever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 25th day of April 1789.
