Now I Give in the hands of my beloved wife all my Estate both Real and Personal to dispose of as she thinks proper to discharge my Debt and Raise my Children and if there is any thing remaining I Give to be sold at his Death and Will is that she Give such Provisions amongst my Child Children in manner as she thinks proper also I Give my beloved wife Sarah my Last Dignity to be the same as my Last Will and Testament, and I Will my wife have her share at my last Will this 11th day of July 1788.
