In the Name of God Amen. I John Gunn being sick and
 Weak but of Perfect sense and Memory do make this my Last
 Will and Testament and do Dispose of my Estate in the form
 following To wit I do give to my son Jesse all my Land I give to
 my son James one Cow and half when he has a mind to take
 them I give to my Daughter Sally one bed and furniture and
 two Cows and calves also Gabriel and Daniel and have care
 to be Delivered to them at the Age of Eighteen out of my Estate
 all the rest of my Estate I have to my wife during her life if
 she continues a Widow to Raise my Children when if she does
 not continue a Widow during her life when she Marries for
 my Estate to be Equally Divided amongst all my Children
 and I do Appoint my wife my Executor and my son James my
 Executor in the said when I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal this seventeenth day of August 1780

In the Name of God Amen. I Robert M. Garland of
 Caswell County and State of N. Carolina on Caswell County being
 Sick and weak of body but of Perfect mind and Memory do make this
 God for the same but willing to mind the Mortality of the body
 and that all of life is as a moment and must die, I give and bequeath
 my soul into the Kingdom of everlasting life and Merits of our
 Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ as for my body I commit to
 the Earth from whence it was taken when I shall please God to
 call me out of Time and as for settling my Temporal Affairs such
 good and Chastels as god of his Infinite mercy shall bestow upon
 me in this life I Give and Dispose of the same in the manner and
 form following

I Give and Bequeath unto my dear and well beloved wife
 John M. Garland and my son James M. Garland all that Parcel
 of Land I bought of Richard Everidge on the 16th March 1776
 Equally Divided between them I say them and their heirs Lawfully
 Begotten of their body forever - I Give and bequeath unto
 my son James M. Garland a Negro boy named Ned that now lives with
 me I Give to him and the Lawful heirs of his body forever and for
 the want of such heirs to the Lawful heirs Equally to be divided
 I Give and bequeath unto my three sons William Walter & Joseph
 David M. Garland the Land and Plantations whereon I now live
 Containing by Estimate the Hundred Acre to be Equally Divided
 amongst them I say to them their heirs Lawfully Begotten of their
 Bodies forever and for want of such heirs to fall to those that are
 Lawful heirs -

I Give and Bequeath unto my son William M. Garland a Negro
 boy named Nene to him and the Lawful heirs of his body for and for
 want of such heirs to fall to them that are such - I Give and
 Bequeath unto my son Walter M. Garland a Negro Girl named
 Parah to him his heirs Lawfully begotten of his body forever and
 for want of such heirs to fall to those that have Lawful heirs
