the County of Caswell and province of North Carolina being in
a low State of Health but of Perfect Sense and Memory
I make be given to God. Calling to mind the shortness
of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to
die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament
That it to my Family and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave
it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in
Decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my Executors
Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall
Receave the same again by the Mighty power of God
and as Touching such worldly Estate Wherewith it

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hath pleased God to Bless me in this life I Give Promise
and Dispose of the same after the following manner First
I Give to my Well Beloved Wife Sarah & Hanes one
Signe of Life Named Hannah During her a natural
life but if the Said Hannah Should have any Children
before my son Joseph ^{being} of age I leave such Children
or child if but one to be Equally Divided at the time
of my son Joseph being of age between my son Joseph
and my Daughter Mary and the above said Hannah
and the Rest of her Inheritance to be Equally Divided
between my son Joseph and Daughter Mary at the Death
of my well Beloved Wife and as to the rest of my Estate
be it of what kind or Quality soever I leave it to my Well
Beloved Wife Sarah & Hanes During the time she Remains my
Widow and at her Intermarriage I leave the same to be sold
and the Money to be Equally Divided between my son
Joseph & Daughter Mary Except one third part which I leave
to my Wife During her life and at her Death to be Equally
Divided between my son Joseph and my Daughter Mary
but if my son Joseph & Daughter Should both die before
of age then I give their Estate to my Well Beloved Wife to
Dispose of as she shall think Proper
Secondly and Lastly I Appoint Constituted and Ordain
my Father Samuel Hanes and Joseph Condit Whole and
Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Nothing
and Regard nothing at all to any other Will or Wills by me
heretofore Made Publishing and Declaring this to be my Last
