we Mary Cooper alias Gibson in conjunction with James
Gibson one of the Legatus hath received of the Orphans money
to the amount of fifty pounds six Shillings for the use &
Support of the Family We therefore make Over and del-
iver the following Articles to Thomas Douglass Guardian
to be of the Children the which Land and Horses we have
now in possession Viz: One Tract of Land which we now
hold on which we have live which was purchased from Thomas
Hilgare also four head of Horses that was lately purchased
with part of said money two Bay Horses a Red Eagle Mare
and a Samel Mare and we now having them in possession
for the Legatus use we Obligate ourselves Weithen to keep
or Dispose of Either Land or Horses without the leave
and Allowance of the said Tho. Douglass untill the Legatus
be fully paid and that they are at the Disposal of the
said Guardian in behalf of the Legatus In Witness whereof
we set Our hands and Affix Our Seals this 29th day of
December in the year of Our Lord 1786. in the 10th year of his
Independence

and constitute and Again at Pleasure to revoke ratifying

Whosoever my said Attorney shall lawfully so in and
about the Premises by Virtue hereof In Witness whereof
