This Indenture Witnesseth that James Granton son of
James Granton Senr. now of age, hath put himself as
by these presents hath put himself voluntarily and of
his own free will and accord, put himself apprentice to
Robert M. Reynolds of the County of Caswell and State
of North Carolina Master, to learn his Trade or Mystery
and after the manner of an Apprenticeship to serve him
from the day of the date hereof for and during the term
of Two years next ensuing during all which time
the said Apprenticeship his Master for the said term
his servants shall keep his Lawfull Command, every
where Gladly Obedy, he shall do no Damage to his said
Master nor see it to be done by Others without
Letting or Giving notice to his said Master he shall
not waste his said Master Goods or Land them

Masterfully to any. He shall not play any unlawful
Game whereby his said Master may be Damaged with
his own Goods or Goods of Others; he shall not absent
himself day or night from his Masters Service without
his Leave, nor haunt any Taverns. But in all things
behave himself as a faithful僕人 ought to do
Among the said Term and the said Master shall
at the pleasure of his Executors to Teach or cause
to be Taught or Instructed in said Art or Mystery
of the better Trade and Shewes and broader Pa-
tish Supplement. Meats Drink Washing and Laying
and Mending getting for an Apprentice. During the said
Term for the due Performance of all and every of the
said Covenants and Agreements of the said Parties
bound themselves to the Other by their Presents In Witness
whereof we both set our hands & Seals this Seventh
day of June Anno Domini 1784

And the said James Crumpton has firmly agreed to Obey
himself to appear at Our next Court held in this
County of Caswell and acknowledge at the recording
of this Quod, that he the said Crumpton shall serve
the above Space of Two years with the said Robert
McReynolds on any Part of the Continent which
the said McReynolds may choose to move to
Should it so happen that the said McReynolds
should move within the Execution of the said

This Indenture made this 3^d day of March Anno Domini
1783 Between James Sanders Esq. on behalf of his fellow
Parties of the Inferior Court of the County of Caswell
and the Execution of the one Part & Thomas Callum Esq.
of the other Part, Witnesseth that the said James Sanders
Esq. in pursuance to an Order of the said County Court
made the Third day of March 1783 and according
to our General Assembly in that case made & provided
doth put place & bind unto the said Thomas Callum Esq.
Viceroy Gallahy an orphan now of the age of seven years
and six months, with the said Thomas Callum to live after
the manner of an apprentice servant until he attain
to the age of eighteen years, during all which time his
said Master faithfully shall serve, his lawful commands
every where gladly obey, he shall not at any time absent
himself from his said Master Service without leave, but in
all things as a good and faithful servant be true & watch
his said Master, And the said Thomas Callum doth
promise covenant and agree to and with the said James
Sanders Esq. that he will Teach & instruct or cause to
be Taught & instructed the said Viceroy Gallahy to read
Write & Cypher according to law, and also instruct
him in the business of agriculture, & that he will constantly
feed and provide for the said Apprentice sufficient
Oat Washing lodging and Apparel during the Term
above telling for an apprentice, And also all other
things necessary both in sickness & health. In Witness
