This Indenture made the 18th day of January 1786
Between Robert Dickinson Esq. in behalf of his fellow Debtors of the
County Court of Council their Successors of the one part & Joseph Taylor
of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robert Dickinson Esq. in
Pursuance to an order of the said Court made the 17th day of October
and according to the Directions of the act of our Gov. Assembly in that
case made & provided. Doth put place and bind unto the said Joseph
Taylor Mary Davis an African now of the age of two years
With the said Joseph Taylor to live after the manner of an
Apprentice and Servant until the said Apprentice shall attain
to the age of Eighteen years, During all which time the said
Apprentice her said Master faithfully shall serve his lawful
Commands every where gladly obey she shall not at any time
Absent herself from her said Masters Service without leave but
in all things as a Good Faithfull servant shall behave towards
her said Master. And the said Joseph Taylor doth promise
Covenant and Agree to and With the said Robert Dickinson
that he will teach or cause to be Taught & Instructed the said
Apprentice to Read Write &c. According to Law, and also teach
her the Art or Mystery of a spinster, and that he will constantly
Feed and provide for the said Apprentice Sufficient food and
Washing lodging and Apparel fitting for an apprentice
during the term above. With other things necessary both in
Sickness or health. In Witness whereof the Parties to this
Indenture hath interchangeably set their hands & seals the day
before first above written
