Simah and Gaber, I Give to Robert Pinckney one Bed Furniture
one Case of Books & my Will

I Give to my son James Pinckney Ten pounds Hard money
& I Give to John Pinckney son of Sam Pinckney Ten my Watch and
Physical books & Instruments

I Give to my son John Pinckney the Negro Matthias I Give
to Rebecca Pinckney Daughter of John Pinckney the Negro Fanny
I Give Mother Pinckney Daughter of John Pinckney the Negro
Baddock, I Give to Nancy Pinckney the Daughter of
John Pinckney the Negro Willey, all the remainder
of my Estate land, House Good & Chattels I Give to
my son John Pinckney and do appoint John Pinckney
and Robert Pinckney my Executors and do Give John
