*1st Jesse Jones Will

I then give unto my son Thurg Jones and to his heirs for ever the first he has now enjoyed with three hundred acres of the convenient land thereto adjoining, one Negro Boy named Daniel, one Negro Boy named Peter, the stock of cattle, horses & hogs that he has already in his possession, one feather bed and common furniture, one saddle and bridle bone Gun. I then give unto my son Godridge Jones the cleared ground belonging to the plantation I bought of John Roper that lies on the West side of Samuel W. Wemy's tract with three hundred acres of the convenient land thereto adjoining, one Negro Boy named Ned, one Negro boy named Isaac, one Horse saddle & bridle, two cows and calves, two sows & pigs, one feather bed & common furniture, one Gun to him for ever, I then give unto my son William Jones, and to his heirs for ever my other plantations with all the remainder of my lands, he allowing his & others the

(105) Liberty of living on what part of the land he shall proper, with liberty to clear, plant, sow, reap, as he thinks fit to live on as long as he lives single & no longer, I then give unto my son William one Negro Boy named Moses, one Negro boy girl named Anna, one Horse saddle & bridle, two cows & calves, two sows & pigs, one feather bed & common furniture, one Gun. I then give unto my daughter Sally Jones, one Negro Girl named Rose, one negro girl, named Jude, one Horse saddle & bridle, two cows & calves, two sows & pigs, one feather bed & common furniture to her and her heirs for ever; I then I give to my Wife Francis Jones all the remainder part of my estate, to make use of so long as she lives single. In case my son or son should be called to the war, my Will is that she may still have liberty to sell one Negro fellow named Hampton in order to exempt him or them from going, and at her death or marriage I give the aforementioned part of my Estate that I have left unto my wife unto my four children above mentioned (to wit, Drury Goodridge, William & Sally Jones) I then I appoint my Wife Francis and my son Drury Jones Executors of this my last Will & Testament, revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me. I Witness hereof these presents to let my hand & seal this Twenty Eight day of January One thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty.
