Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty Between James Sanders,
C of C Sheriff of Bertie County of this and Quarter Sessions of the County
of Caswell and State aforesaid in behalf of the Sheriff of this County of this
Session of the one party, And Samuel Winstead of the other party
Witnesseth that the said James Sanders Esq: in pursuance to an order of the
said Court made the 20th day of March 1780 and according to the direction
of the act of our General Assembly in that case made & provided doth put
in trust unto the said Samuel Winstead George Day (son of Ned Day)
aged four years to live after the Manner of an Apprentice Servant until
he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, during all which time the said
Servant his said Master faithfully shall serve, his lawfull commands
every where gladly obey, He shall not at any time absent himself from
his said Masters service without leave, but in all things as a good and
faithfull Servant shall behave towards his said Master, And the said
Samuel Winstead with earnest promise and agree to and with the said
James Sanders Esq: that he will teach and instruct in cause to be taught
and instructed the said George Day to learn the art of Butcher and that
he will constantly find and procure for the said Servant during the
time aforesd sufficient diet, Washing lodging and apparel fitting
for an Apprentice and also all other things necessary both in
sickness and in health. Mr McTeal who of the parties to these

In the Name of God amow, I James Robinson Esq: of Orange County
in my perfect Sence You may doe commit my body to the Earth by
my Sute to God that here, Item I doe will to bequeath to my son
James Robinson the plantation where he now lies, to be Divided by
alone, begining on the South line, Running Straight to opp the upper
End of the plantation, then turning to the right the upper
End of the North line, Yone Riffle Gun, my own aching Gun to him &
his Heirs forever; Item I give to my youngest son Samuel
Robinson the plantation where now lies, Containing all the rest
of the tract of land below my son James's line but one acre
with my own Hsing bed, with all its furniture there with Belongings to
and all my Stock of all kinds, Horses, cattle & hoggs, to him on the largest
Heirs of his body, lawfully begotten, if none such, to return to all my
Grand children to school them, Item I give to my Grandson Robert
Kenny the plantation where his father Jim Kenny now lies, for
his father & Mother as long as the shall live, or in case to die
in, and then to return to my son James's land joining it, Item
I give to my Daughter Easter one hundred Pds of furniture & for my
son Samuel to pay her fifteen Shillings, yearly for Ten years, &
if she shall die without an Heir for it to be left to all my Grand children
in general, Item I give to my Daughter Jeanina one
Pds without furniture and my son Samuel to pay

(184) he fifteen Shillings quarterly for ten years from my death, Item I give to all the rest of my sons, William Robinson Jacob Robinson John Robinson, Thomas Robinson & Alexander & Robinson's Lawns Skirings, One shilling of each, to be paid by my Executors, Item I give to my grandson David Henry one feather bed at my death, I then appoint my son Thomas Samuel for my Executor of this my last will & Testament

Item I give unto my son Harry Jones and
to his heirs for ever the field he has now cleared with three hundred acres
of the common land thereunto adjoining, one Negro Boy named David
Tom, Negro Boy named Peter, the Stock of cattle, horses, hogs, that he has
already in his possession, one feather Bed and Common furniture, one
Saddle and bridle Horse Gun — Item I give unto my son Godroige Jones
the cleared ground Belonging to the Plantation brought of old Rose
that lies on the West side of Samuel H. Morris's Creek with three hundred
acres of the common land thereunto adjoining, one Negro Boy Name
Peter, one Negro boy around house, one Horse Saddle & bridle Two Calf
and Calves, two Sows & pigs, one feather Bed & Common furniture
one Gun to him this his for day, Item I give unto my son
William Jones, and to his heirs for ever my other plantation with
all the remainder of an acre he allowing his children thus

(185) liberty of living on what part of the land Mr. Shale
proper, with liberty to clear, plant, tend, sow, reap, as she thinks
fit to do so as long as she lives single & unmarried, — I likewise
give unto my son William one Negro Boy named Amos, one Negro boy
girl named Anna, one Horse Saddle & bridle, two cows & calves, two calves
and pigs, one feather Bed & Common furniture, one Gun &
Item I give unto my Daughter Sally Jones, one Negro girl
named Rose, one negro girl, named Judy, one Horse Saddle & bridle, two
cows & calves, two Sows & pigs, one feather Bed & Common furniture taken
and her Rents for ever; Item I bind to my wife Francis Jones all the
remainder part of my Estate, to make use of so long as she lives
in case my son or son should be called to the war, my Will is that she
may still have liberty to sell one Negro fellow named Henry, in order
to exempt him or them from going, and at her death or marriage I
give the aforementioned part of my Estate that those left unto my
wife unto my four children above mentioned (to wit, Drury Godroige
William & Sally Jones) — Lastly I appoint my wife Francis and
my son Drury Jones Executors of this my last Will & Testament
exempting all other Wills, bonds or oaths made by me In witness hereof
I have caused let my hand & seal my seal this Twenty Eighth day of January
One thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty —
