all my body Cloaths to be Delivered to him after my Decease.

I Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter in Law Margret
Wahfield and her two children two flax wheels one loom
(and one Ream) three years old & Side Saddle.

I Item I Order and Devise that nothing of the flooring of my
house where the planks are not laid down be removed.

Lastly I constitute ordain and appoint my Trusty
Friends Arch. Murphy Esq. and John Black
Executors to this my Last will & Testament
and I do Revoke disannul make void all other Wills
by me made and Ratify and Confirm

In the name of God amen I James Ferris of
Orange County in North Carolina Province being in
perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same

But considering the frailty of this life (and the uncertainty of Death) do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner (and form) following. First I Principally Bequeath my Soul to almighty God Trusting thro' the Merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full Pardon and Remission of all my Sins as for my body that to be Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named.

Item I Give to my wife (Daughter Sarah Terry the Improvement whereon I now Live with Ten Pounds Virginia Money, to Clear out the same when the Office shall be opened also fifty Pounds of like Coinage with one Bed and Furniture one Iron Pot and Traying Pan one Dish Six Plates & as many Spoons one Side Saddle one Sord and Pags together with the Cattle Shup and horse (then already in her Possession) to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I Give to my Son Oliver Terry one horse Value to Ten pounds and the Saddle in his Possession one Iron Pot one Traying Pan one Dish Six Plates and Six Spoons one Ruffled Gun one Table one feather Bed and Furniture one Saw and Piggs the Cattle already Delivered to him also one hundred and Thirty four acres of Land out of the Entry

I Bought of James Tinsley adjacent to the River the said Tinsley conveyed to the said Oliver Terry with ten Pounds Virginia Money to get the deed when the Office shall be opened in the said Oliver Terry's Name he paying five Pounds Virginia Money for each hundred Acres in the said Deed being about 300 one hundred and thirty four acres above Given to the Estate hereafter to be lent to my Loving Wife Rebecca Terry also I will that she have Thirty five Pounds Current ^{money} of Virginia Paid her after the Death of my said Loving Wife Rebecca Terry

Item I Give to my Daughter in Law Luina King during her Natural Life the four hundred and thirty acres of Land whereon she now lives with this Provision that her Daughter Grace King may seat on such part of the said Land as may best serve the Mother and Daughter and after the Death of the said Luina King I Give the said four hundred and thirty acres of Land to the said Grace King & the Heirs of her Body lawfully Begotten to be given to her as long as any Child appear (But failing of such Heirs to the next Heirs at Law.

Item It is my Desire if God should Call me out of time before James Murphree has a Deed of Conveyance for the Two hundred acres of Land whereon he now lives that I do wish that John makes him a Deed for the same.

as for the Rest of my Estate (after my lawfull Will
 and General Expressions said) I lend the Same to
 my Loving wife Rebecca Tenny during her
 life and after her Death the Same to be
 divided between my then Surviving Children
 allowing Obed Tenny the Legacy of thirty five Pounds
 about mentioned out of the Same or out of my Son
 in Law Nathaniel Bullenies as by their several
 Accts. will appear which also be Brought in and
 Answered to the Estate before a Division made it
 to my will & Desire that no part of my Estate
 be Inventoried, or appraised but that my then
 Surviving Children Divide the Same Giving the Young-
 est First Choice and so on that the eldest to have
 the last Choice but in Case there should be any Dis-
 pencies arise I constitute Nathl. Tenny & Obed Tenny
 to arbitrate in selling the Same. Lastly I do appoint
 Obed Tenny Nathaniel Bullenies and Peter Tenny
 Executors of this my last will and Testament Revok-
 ing all others (Willy by me formerly) made In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto put my Hand
 and affixed my Seal this thirly first day of July
 one thousand seven hundred and twenty five.
