Lining said Mitchell on the South of his Land.

Now if the said John Smith Grants and Givs said Mitchell all the Privileges on said Land above Designated as the it was own Land without any Collaboration or Interfierance whatsoever that then, the above Obligation to be Used & of no Effect Otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue in Law
