I say to her and her Heirs Lawfully of her body and for want
of such Heirs to fall to those that are I Give and Bequeath
unto my son Robert McFarland a Lad Named Will and one Francis
Rounds if the money is as small a Value as it is now at this Present time
and my Desire is that John Rounds and my Daughter Martha Rounds
Should keep and take care of my son Robert and what Belongs to him
and I Give whatever I have got my son Robert to my Daughter
Martha Rounds after his Death to her Heirs forever

If my Negro Woman Sam has any more Children the first born
I leave to my Daughter Martha Rounds and her Heirs forever

I Give and Leave unto my dear and well beloved wife Margaret
the McFarland the whole Amount of my Estate Land and Negroes houses
hold Goods and furniture During her Natural Life if she continues
a Widow but if she Marries then the whole of my Estate that I have not
already Bequeathed to be Equally Divided amongst my children
and likewise I Give and leave my Negro Man Will and my Negro Woman
Sara to my wife to Maintain her and her small Children During
as above said

Lastly I do Declare and Appoint Margaret McFarland my
Dear and well beloved wife and John my son to be whole and sole
Executors of this my Last will and Testament Discharging

Having View all wills and Testaments by me made this only to be my
Last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal the said day of
October the 17th 1780

#13 The Last Will of John James Williams

In the Name of God Amen I John James Williams
of the State of South Carolina and of County Sea District
but now in the State of North Carolina as a Refugee Give Being
at Present in my Prosper health and of sound Memory but
considering that it is appointed for all men Once to Die I do
Declare this to be my Last Will and Testament First I'm the
Great Good of His Majesty Give my soul to God that have
it me at first In and Through the Merits of Christ the Son
of Manhood and then my body to be decently buried at the
Discretion of my Executors hereafter to be mentioned
I'm the First It is my will and Desire that all my Just Oaths
be paid

I'm the Second I Give to my well beloved wife Mary
Williams During her Natural Life a Part of the Tract of Land
that I Live upon Situated Between the County Sea District and
as follows (that is to say) On the South Side of the River Beginning
On the River below the Mills Where the Lane crosses the River
from thence Along the line of the River to the

Calcutt to a great bundle thereof. The Amount to the same
 I have paid them along the road to where it abuts on the main
 Lane and so along the road to where all the Lane bought of
 John Caldwell of Land bought with Gil Simon. I have taken
 Of Daniel Simpson for the Term of Release. I have and by right
 To my Beloved Wife Mary Williams a Child Part of my Moveable
 Estate to be equally Divided by Lot at the Discretion of my Executors

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Williams the following
 Tract of Land as follows the Land bought of William ... Containing
 250 Acres Land bought of Robert Johnson Estate 100 Acres Land
 Bought of William. Besides 75 Acres of Land that Part of a Tract of
 Land that was bought of William is situated below the Little house
 that says on the North side of the Charles Town Road thought
 to be about 80 Acres I give Part of all my Moveable Estate
 When he comes to the age of Twenty one Years or more

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Williams the following
 Tract of Land the Tract of Land bought of Jonathan Leonard 250
 Acres. Tract bought of James 100 Acres and all that Part of
 the Land bought of Calcutt that Lays below the Little house branch
 caught a 100 Acres that is situated for the Little that says the
 Hill below the branch I that Tract of the Land bought of William
 Johnson that Lays the South side of the Charles Town Road. I
 give Part of all my Moveable Estate to be given up to him at
 his coming to Twenty one Years of Age

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son William all that Tract
 of Land that I bought of Calcutt that Lays below the Road
 and the Great branch of the Land bought of Peter. I thought by
 computation 100 Acres I give Part of all my Moveable Estate
 at his coming to the age of 21 years

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Williams
 that Tract of Land bought of Capt. Jacob Lott for 100 Acres and
 a Child Part of all my Moveable Estate to be delivered to her on
 her Marriage if she Marries Agreeable to the desire of the Executors.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Williams
 that Tract of Land on back town bought of John Hammons at the old

Store containing 100 - Tons and a Child Part of all my Moveable
 Estate to be delivered on her Marriage if agreeable to the Executors

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Williams as much
 Cash Part of my Estate before the Division is made as will fetch her
 a Tract of Land Equal in Value to either of her Sisters Land.
 Mentioned above and a Child Part of all my Moveable Estate to be
 delivered on her Marriage if agreeable to the Executors

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son James Williams all that Part
 of the Land bought of John Caldwell on the North side of the
 River above the Little house branch by computation 800 Acres
 and a Child Part of all my Moveable Estate to be delivered on his
 coming of age

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my son Washington Williams all that
 Tract of Land lent to my beloved Wife during her Natural Life
 and the Land bought of James Cook by computation 600 Acres
 and a Child Part of all my Moveable Estate to be delivered at his
 arrival at 21 Years of age

It is my Will and Desire that as soon as Government after my Death
 that all my Land that is not Willed away that is to say 100 Acres of Land
 and the Land bought of William Johnson on the River James &
 my Slaves and Six Waggon and Horses and Hired Cattle
 should be sold at publick Auction and the New York and the Bonds &
 and other due to be sold at the same time

Item 10th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Williams all that
 Tract of Land bought of the Ballance to be divided amongst my
 Beloved Wife and my Eight Children or such of them as then Live
 to be my Waggon, there is one Road Waggon and Eight Work Horses to be
 reserved for the use of my Family and my Beloved Wife is to have 3
 Chaise Horses and two Chaises for the use of the Family and each of my
 Children to be furnished with a good riding horse and a Riding
 Horse as the Executors may think fit

Item 11th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Williams all that
 Tract of Land bought of the Ballance to be divided amongst my
 Beloved Wife and my Eight Children or such of them as then Live
 to be my Waggon, there is one Road Waggon and Eight Work Horses to be
 reserved for the use of my Family and my Beloved Wife is to have 3
 Chaise Horses and two Chaises for the use of the Family and each of my
 Children to be furnished with a good riding horse and a Riding
 Horse as the Executors may think fit

No 17 The Last Will & Testament of Ephraim Logue

In the Name of God Amen This Twenty-fifth of June
 in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty
 Ephraim Logue of Caswell County State of N^o Carolina (Planters)

Being Perfectly healthy of body and Memory but Called to defend the
 Liberty of said State Thanks be to god Given for the same Calling
 to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that after appointing
 for all men One to Die do make and Ordain this my Last Will
 and Testament (That is to say) Principally of good will

I Give and Recommend my soul to God who gave the same and for my
 body I leave the same to the Discretion of fellow Soldiers to be
 Buried in a Christian and Decent Manner (Noting Cautioning
 but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the
 Mighty Power of God &c and as Touching such worldly Estate
 Wherewith God hath Endowed me in this life I Give and Dispose of
 the same in the Manner and form following

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I Give and bequeath to Ellina Logue my beloved and only
 Daughter the Plantation and Improvements whereon I now Live &
 the Entry (Appointing) to be held by her and no other after the year of
 1781 except she should Die without Issue to be Divided
 with Ephraim Thompson and the first male Son of my Brother John Logue
 Naming him Ephraim Logue and if John Logue Dies without Issue
 then the same Ephraim Logue son of John Logue his Son of said Estate
 to go to be Divided between James Linsay son of my sister Mary & son
 of my sister Margaret &c and the Plantation purchased
 by James Bracken on Queen's Creek I Give to my Son-in-law
 Logue to be used as her own (Quarry) National Taxes and all her
 Debts to Alexander Mathews Esq and James Esq Mathews
 and my Personal Estate after the Payment of my Just and Lawful
 Debts to be Two Thirds to my only Daughter Ellina & One Third to
 my Beloved Wife Mary who Alexander Mathews of Guilford County
 & Thomas Thompson of Orange County I Appoint to Carry as my last
 and only Will & Testament Confirming the same in the Presence of
 God and hereunto setting my hand and seal at the Station of said
 Logue last and Ordained the Date Above Written before us present
