This day came John Clayton before me one of the Justices for the said County and made Oath on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that John Hennis departed this life the last day of June 1792 and that he when in his proper Senses made this his Verbal Will Vizt— I give to my wife Anna Hennis all my lands Stock and Household Furniture During her Natural Life and for her to Dispose of it as she pleases &c also Elizabeth Clayton Declareth on Oath the same Day and Date that she heard John Hennis (Deceased) say that it was his Desire that his wife should have his Whole Estate to do as she pleased with

This Indenture made this 9<sup>th</sup> Day of Septemr Anno Domini 1792 Between John Atkinson Esq. on the behalf of his fellow Justices of the Inferior Court of the County of Caswell & then Successors of the One part and James Fargher of the Other Part Witnesseth that the said John Atkinson Esq. in pursuance to an Order of the said County Court made the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of June 1792 and according to the Decision of our General Assembly on that case made and provided Both part place and Hand unto the said James Fargher

218 Thomas Price an orphan Boy of the age of ten years &c his father with the said James Fargher to be after the manner of an Apprentice and servant until he attain the age of Twenty one year During all which time his said Master he faithfully shall execute his Lawfull Command wery where Gladly Oby he shall not at any time Absent himself from his said Master, Service without leave first in all things as a good and Lawfull Servant Behave Towards his said Master and the said James Fargher doth Covenant promise and agree and with the said John Atkinson that he will Teach and Instruct and cause to be Taught and Instructed the said Thomas Price to Read Write and Cypher according to Law and also Instruct Instruct him in the Business of a planter & that he will constantly send and provide for the said apprentice Sufficient Diet Washing and Lodging and Apparel During the Term above said getting for in Appearance of also all other things necessary both in business and in Health In Witness where of the Parties to these presents both Interchangably set their hands and seals the Day and year first above Written
