of the County of Curwile and State of North Carolina
living, weak of body, but of perfect Mind and Memory
do make this my last Will and in Manner and
form following - Viz. I Recommend my soul to
almighty God who gave it in full Assurance
of the resurrection to eternal Life through our
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in whose Merits
I trust only to be saved and my body to the Church

Earth to be buried in such Decent Manner as my
Executors hereafter named shall think Convenient
and as touching such Worldly estate as it hath pleased
Almighty God to give me, my will and Desire is
the same may be Employed as hereafter this my Will
shall Express them -

Item, It is my Will and Desire that after all my Children
receive their Principle Money, that whatsoever Estate
of Mine appears, to be both in Negroes & Moveables shall
be Equally Divided amongst all my children, Excepting
Sarah Pennant, Likewise, Except one feather bed &
furniture, my Hogs, about Ads, and the crop for the
year 1784 which I give and bequeath to my son George
Lea as a legacy - And Lastly I Nominate and
Appoint James Lea & my son George Lea my sole
Executors of this my last Will and Testament in
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
Seal the third day of November 1784.
