teenth day of November one thousand Seven Hundred &
Eighty one make & publish this my last will & Testament
in the manner following, that is to say, First, I Give & Bequeath
to my Nephew Andrew Ferguson, Ten Thousand Pounds -
Item, I Give and Bequeath to James Dobbin (my Cousin Hugh
Dobbin's Son) Three Thousand Pounds -
Also, I Give and Bequeath to John Dobbin Brother to James
Dobbin, Three Thousand Pounds, -
Also I Give and Bequeath to Elizabeth Cogh, one bed & Furniture
thereof, my Christ and what Clothes did belong to my wife
and my Horse -

Also, I Give and Bequeath to Mary Dumas five Hundred &
Thirty five Dollars - & I do make & ordain Andrew
Ferguson & David Cole Executors of this my last will &
Testament In Witness whereof I the said Hugh Dobbin
have to this my last will and Testament set my hand & Seal
the day & Year above Written -

1780 In the name of God amen, This Saturday day of June
One thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty one, I John Lett of the County
of Caswell State of North Carolina being Sick and Weak of
Body but of Perfect Sound Memory (Thanks be given to God)
do Calling to mind the frailty of my body & uncertainty of
this life do make Ordain & Appoint this my last will & Testament
in the following & manner -

First, I Give and Bequeath to my son Robert Lett one
of Negro fellows named George, Also One Thousand & One hundred Virginia
State Currency, But if the said Robert Lett shall die without law-
-full issue I do give & Devise that the said Negro shall serve his Masters
or Heirs during his natural life or Widowhood & that he shall
die. So that the said Negro shall be sold & the money to be
Equally Divided amongst the Children of my son William Lett & his
Heirs.

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son John Lett, Two Negroes to wit
Jeffy & Hannah & a boy with one Thousand pounds Virginia State
Money and one Crop of Cotton to him & his Heirs for ever -

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Catherine & her Heirs
Two Negroes to wit, Fanny, a French & Dutch girl with One Thousand
pounds Virginia State Currency to her & her Heirs for ever -

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary & her Heirs
Two Negroes to wit, Fanny & Hannah & a boy with one
Thousand pounds Virginia State Money to her & her Heirs for ever -

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son in law Samuel Cunningham
of Currency to him & his Heirs for ever -

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my son in law David Logan Twenty
of Currency to him & his Heirs for ever -

Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter in law Rebecca Lett
Twenty Shillings to her & her Heirs for ever -

Item, I Order and Devise that my Executors sell my Two negroes, to wit,
Gash & Dick & the money to be Divided One third to my grandson
John Cunningham Son of my Grand Daughter Hannah Cunningham,
