This Indenture made this 22nd day of April 1788 between David Stetten Esquire in behalf of the Executors and heirs Successors of the County Court of Caswell on the one Part and John Corrie of the other Part Witnesseth that the said David Stetten in Pursuance of an Order of the said Court made this day and date above written and according to the Directions of the Act of our Gov^t of Pennsylvania that case made & provided with that said Court unto the said John Corrie James Smith above born Child now of the age of six years on the said John Corrie to be after the manner of an Apprenticeship to serve until he shall attain to the age of Twenty one year serving all which time the said Apprenticeship his said Master shall faithfully serve his said Master every where & shall be at any time absent himself from his Masters service but in such things as a Good and faithful Servant labour towards his said Master & that the said John Corrie doth Covenant Promise and Agree to and with the said David Stetten that he will Teach and instruct in such to be taught and instructed the said James James Smith Reading to draw to Read thought after the art and manner of a Planter and that he will Constantly provide for the said Apprentices serving the Term aforesaid sufficient with Washing & Lodging and Apparel fitting for an Apprentice and all other things necessary both in such things and in Health & Welfare whereof the parties to this present have interchangeably set their hands & seals this day & year first above written
