 And at her Decease to belong to Dudley Galloway

I Give and Bequeath unto my Nephew Dudley Galloway
 all my whole estate after the Decease of my wife Martha
 Galloway to him and his Heirs forever and I do hereby constitute
 and appoint him the said Dudley Galloway my whole
 and sole Executor in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of October 1769

 Hafford and John Campbell, containing 133 Acres
 Item, I Give and Bequeath to my Wife Ruth the
 Land I now Live on and her three Saddle & Feather bed
 and Furniture - Item, I Give & Bequeath to my
 Daughter Elizabeth one Feather bed & Furniture
 Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Daniel a
 Dish & Plates and a Razor, And the other Part
 to be Equally Divided between Elizabeth their Mother
 and the other Household Goods to be Equally Divided
 between the Children & their Mother till they keep them
 During her Widowhood or till they come of Age & then
 the Children to have their Parts. And I Give my Brother
 Stephen Jergent & Joseph Gold My Cartth to my Estate
 it being my last will & Testth whereunto I set my hand
