 Between James Sanders Esq<sup>r</sup> on behalf of himself & his wife the Informer  
 Count of the County of Craven & their Successors of the One Part  
 & William Huston of the Other Part Witnesseth that the said  
 James Sanders Esq<sup>r</sup> In Pursuance to an Order of the said  
 County Court made the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of March 1783 and according  
 to the Directions of our Hon<sup>r</sup> Assembly in that case made  
 & provided doth Put & Seal and bind unto the said William  
 Huston, Anderson Haralson an Officer free of the age of  
 Seven years & Two Months with the said William Huston to live  
 after the Manner of an Apprentice Servant until he attain  
 the age of Twenty one years during which time his said  
 Master he faithfully shall serve his Lawfull Commandments  
 which yearly he shall not at any time absent himself  
 from his said Master Service without leave in all things  
 as good and faithfully behave towards his said Master  
 And the said William Huston with Covenant promises  
 to agree to and with the said James Sanders that he will  
 work and labour to be taught and Instructed by the said Anderson  
 Haralson to Read Writ & Copy him according to Law & also  
 Instruct him in the Business of a Planter and that he will  
 constantly tend & Provide for the said Apprentice sufficient  
 and Necessary Lodging and apparel during the Term aforesaid  
 getting for an Apprentice and also all other things necessary  
 both in respect of his Health & Witness whereof the  
 Parties to these presents hath Interchangeable set their  
 hands & seals the day & year first above written
