 And Over, 1783, Sarah Bowles of Concord County,
 State of North Carolina, being sick in body but of
 good perfect Memory, Thank be to Almighty God and
 calling to remembrance the uncertain Estate of this
 Transitory life and that all flesh must yield unto
 death do make and declare this my last will &
 Testament in Manner and form following
 First being Penitent and Sorry for all my Sins
 Recommend my soul unto Almighty God my Saviour
 and Redeemer, in whom they whose merits I
 Trust and believe assuredly to be saved He have full
 Remission Forgiveness of all my Sins He Inherit the
 Kingdom of Heaven, And my body I Commit to
 the Earth to be decently buried at the direction of
 my Executors Hereafter named, After the settling
 of my Temporal Estate and such Goods, Chattels
 and Debts as it hath pleased God to bestow upon
 me I do Order and give and dispose the same
 in Manner following, That is to say I Give
 and bequeath, unto John Bowles one Negro man
 named Langston, Also one Negro man named
 James, Also one Negro woman named Sarah
 (it is my will that the said Sarah keep her children
 until each of them is seven years old) to him
 this Will for ever, Also my Bay horse named Buck
 Also four head of horned Cattle, Also one Plaster
 dish and two Plaster plates
 Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary
 Washington, my Negro Girl named Hannah
 during

during my said daughter Marys Natural life and after
 her Death to return to my Grand Daughter Sarah Bowles,
 Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Yeargin
 my Negro Girl named Judy, to her and her Heirs for
 ever, Also one Plaster dish and two Plaster plates
 and one Plaster Basin
 Item I Give and bequeath unto
 Benjamin Yeargin my Negro Boy named Samuel
 to him and his Heirs of his body for ever, (but if the
 said Benjamin Yeargin, dies without Heirs of his
 body the said Negro, shall return unto John Yeargin
 his Brother Also one Plaster dish
 Item I Give and bequeath unto my
 Grandson Andrew Yeargin my Negro Child
 named Till, to him this Will for ever
 Item I Give and bequeath unto my
 Granddaughter Sarah Bowles one Plaster bed &
 Furniture Also one Coffee pot,
 Item I Give and bequeath unto my
 Granddaughter Mary Bowles, one Plaster bed &
 Furniture, Also one Spice Mortar
