The Condition of the above Obligation is such that Whereas the above bound John Smith hath Granted free privilege, fully given up and admitted of the said David & Mitchell his heirs Executors and Assigns of all kinds such as Darts or fence of any kind on his own line on the North side of and on the said Smiths Land joining said David & Mitchell on the South of his Land Now if the said John Smith Grants and Gives said Mitchell all the Privilege on said Land above Described as tho it was own Land without any Abolition or Interruption whatever That then the above Obligation to be void & of no Effect Otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue in Law signed sealed & Delivered in the presence of
