 and the other half of my Pewter — Item I
 Give to my loving Wife Two Cows and Calves, one Mare
 bridle Blade, three Sheep; Now the Balance of my
 Estate to be Equally Divided, Alivest my Wife & Children

 the said Sarah Goodell doth agree to bind unto the said
 William Morrow, two female Children of the Partner
 of Mary Goodell and Elizabeth Goodell of the age of
 Twelve Months, until they shall arrive to the age
 of Eighteen years to live with him the said
 Morrow as Purchaser and Servants, during such
 and shall obey all his lawful Commands, they
 shall not at any time Absent themselves from
 their Master's house without leave but in all things
 as a Good and Lawful Servants behave to him.
