This Indenture made this 19th day of October A^dm¹⁷⁹⁰.
Between Thomas Rice Esquire on behalf of the Justices and their
Simpsons of the County of Carroll of the one part and
Edward V. Neill of the other part Witnesseth that the said
Thomas Rice in pursuance to an Order of the said Court made
the day and date above written and according to the direction
of the Gen^l Assembly in that case made do hereby do hereby
put place and bind unto the said Edward V. Neill, Thomas
Sutton an Orphan now of the age of Two years last August
with the said Edward V. Neill to live after the manner of an
Apprentice servant until he shall attain to the age of Twenty
One years during all which time the said Apprentice his said
Master faithfully shall serve his Lawfull Commands every
where Gladly Obey he shall not at any time Absent
himself from his said Master's service without leave but in
all things as a Good and faithful servant shall behave
Towards his said Master And the said Edward V. Neill
doth Covenant Promise and Agree to and with the said
Thomas Rice that he will Teach and Instruct and cause to
be taught and Instructed the said Thomas Sutton reading
to read Right W^{ts} also the Art and Mystery of
a Planter and that he will Constantly feed and provide for
the said Apprentice during the Term aforesaid sufficient
with Washing Lingerie and Apparel fitting for an
Apprentice and servant and also all other things
necessary both in Litterary and in Health Instructing
through the Parties to these presents both Indebtedly
set their hands & seals the day and year above written
