The Last Will and Testament of Robert Bumpus do^r.
 In the name of God Amen. the thir day of January in the year
 one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven. I Robert Bumpus
 of the County and Province of North Carolina, being sick and weak
 of mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God, for his mer-
 cy, to wiss the mortality of my body, and knowing that
 I am now about to die; I do make and devise this my
 last Will, Principally and first of all I give and recommend
 my soul into the hands of God that gave it
 me, and I commend it to the Church to be buried in a
 Christian manner, and at the discretion of my Executors,
 without doubting but at the Court
 of the same again by me to have

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of God. And in bequeathing my wordly Estate to him with such proviso
 as in this life to like me with after my last Will and Testament
 as are said I give devise and dispose of, in manner and form as
 followeth. Item. I bind unto my wellbelov'd wife & Son

Rumphae, the Land and Plantation, and all my negroes together with
 my Stock and ^{household} furniture, with my ship, and working Tools during
 her natural life or Widow hood, but at the Death or marriage of my
 wife said Rumphae, that all my lands and Negroes with all
 the rest of my Estate may be sold for ready money, and the money
 equally divided between my well beloved son, and Daughters, that is
 to say, my son John Rumphae, and my Daughters, Lucy Winters,
 and my Daughter Elizabeth Davis and Agnes Pratt, and Winifred
 Winters, and Martha Miller, to have and their heirs forever.

Item. I make and Ordain my true and Lawful Friends and Executors
 as in my last Will and Testament, that is to say, my true friends
 Captain Davis, and John Rumphae, and John Rumphae, the
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament, Retesting and subscrib-
 ing this and no other to be last Will and Testament, in the presence
 of above named witnesses at my hand and seal, the day and year
 first above written.
