Indenture from John, wife Robert W. Co. and Dr.

This Indenture Making this 2nd day of August the 17th of
 1784 Between the County of Carroll in the State of New York
 of the one part and Robert McQueen of the County of Carroll
 of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robert McQueen
 do hereby certify that the said County of Carroll is in the State

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or Mystery, and after manner of an Apprentice from the day & date here being the 25th day of January, and during the Term of sixteen years he being only 5 years of age during all which Term the said Apprentice, his Master faithfully shall serve his Lords his his lawful Commands and obey, he shall do no damage to his said Master, nor see it to be done by others, he shall not be absent himself day nor night, from his Master's Service without his leave, but in all things behave himself, as a faithful Apprentice ought to do during the said Term of above mentioned, and shall provide for him sufficient, meat drink apparel, lodging and washing, fitting for an Apprentice, during the said Term, and either of the said Parties bind themselves unto the other by these Parents. In witness whereof, they have set their hands & seals this 25th day of January, and in the third year of our Independence.
