I Robert Huston of the County of Caswell and State of North Carolina

my body of knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do  
die and certain the my last Will and Testament that is to say  
Privately and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands  
of Almighty God that gave it and my body I commend to the Earth  
to be Buried in Graceful Cheshire Manse at the Discrepancy long  
Benton falling Distant but at the General Resurrection  
will receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as  
falling Luck Marley estate wherewithal it falls Please god to help  
me with in this life Isaac and Dennis and Captain of the same and  
following Manse uniform First H. Giv. and Bequatt to my Son  
Will. H. Huston all my reasonable Estate to hold the same in his own name  
leaving his Widewhood and to Captain of the same to the best of  
the Hertford People and to have his Living upon the Land unmeddled  
leaving his Widewhood Secondly H. Giv. and Bequatt to my two sons  
James Huston & William Huston an Improvement of Land wherof I  
have Containing Two Hundred and Sixty Acres to the same name  
To be Equally Divided Between them & Thirdly I leave one Regn  
all to my son George Huston the sum of Two Hundred pounds Sterling  
Dong & Fully I give and Bequatt to my Daughter Mary  
of Hertford her Husband and I afford and Ordain my will is  
for Huston and my Son George Huston to be my Execut. &  
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year
