 And that one at Michael Jacksons House should be bound to learn
 the Trade or other and one at Person should be bound to
 Silver Smith & Elkanah to a Saddler and John a Mill Writ and
 Indentured to Blacksmith and Hecia to a Gunner and lastly
 I Appoint John Brown & Henry Harley to be Executors of
 this my Last Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal the Thirtieth day of April 1781

In the name of God - I am on the 23rd day of Oct 1778,

I Robert Huston of the County of Caswell and State of North Carolina
 being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory
 Thanks be given unto God thus far calling to mind the frailty of
 my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die do
 Make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is to say
 Unlawfully and first of all I Give and recommend my soul into the hands
 of the Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth
 to be buried in Christ Church a Burial at the Discretion of my
 Executors, nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I
 shall receive the same again by the highly Power of God and as
 touching such worldly estate whomever it hath pleased God to Bless
 me with in this Life I Give and Recommend Dispose of the same and
 leaving Margaret my wife First I Give and Bequeath to my son
 John Huston all my movable Estate to hold the same in fee and to have
 during his Widowhood and to be paid of the same to the Executors
 and to his heirs proper and to have his Living upon the Land unmolested
 during his Widowhood secondly I Give and Bequeath to my two sons
 James Huston & William Huston an Improvement of Land whereof
 one has Containing Five Hundred and sixty Acres in the same Maner
 to be Equally Divided between them & thirdly I Give and Bequeath
 to my son George Huston the sum of Five Hundred pounds fourthly
 I Give & Bequeath I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary
 fifty Shillings fifthly I Give and Bequeath and Ordain my wife
 Margaret Huston and my son George Huston to be my Executors And
 I Make of them my Executors at my hand and seal this day and year
