 all the rest of my Estate I have to my wife during her life if
 she continues a Widow to Raise my Children when if she does
 not continue a Widow during her life when she Marries for
 my Estate to be Equally Divided amongst all my Children
 and I do Appoint my wife my Executor and my son James my
 Executor in the said when I have been in it my hand and
 seal this seventh day of August 1780

 my soul into the Kingdom of everlasting life and Merits of our
 Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ as for my body I commit to
 the Earth from whence it was taken when I shall please God to
 call me out of Time and as for settling my Temporal Affairs such
 good and Chastels as god of his Infinite mercy shall bestow upon
 me in this life I Order and Dispose of the same in the manner and
 form following

I give and bequeath unto my dear and well beloved wife
 John M. Garland and my son James M. Garland all that Parcel
 of Land I bought of Richard Everidge on the 16th March 1776
 Equally Divided between them I say them and their heirs Lawfully
 begotten of their body forever I give and bequeath unto
 my son James M. Garland a Negro boy named Ned that now lives with
 me I give to him and the Lawful heirs of his body forever and for
 the want of such heirs to the Lawful heirs Equally to be divided
 I give and bequeath unto my three sons William Walter & Joseph
 David M. Garland the Land and Plantations which now I have
 containing by Metes and Bounds about 1000 Acres to be Equally Divided
 amongst them I say to them their heirs Lawfully begotten of their
 bodies forever and for want of such heirs to fall to those that are
 Lawful heirs

I give and bequeath unto my son William M. Garland a Negro
 boy named Ned to him and the Lawful heirs of his body for and for
 want of such heirs to fall to them that are such I give and
 bequeath unto my son Walter M. Garland a Negro Girl named
 Sarah to him his heirs Lawfully begotten of his body forever and
 for want of such heirs to fall to those that are Lawful heirs

I Give and Bequeath to my son Joseph Davis McFarland
a Negro Girl Named Fanny I say to him he Receiveth
Possession by his body and for want of such Heirs to fall to those
that are Lawful. Likewise I Give and Bequeath unto my Son
son William Walter and Joseph Davis McFarland, each of them
a Good Smart black Bridle and Saddle, I Give and Bequeath
unto my dear and well beloved Daughter Margaret a Negro
Girl called Fanny a mare and Saddle and Bridle a Feather bed and
furniture I say to her and her Heirs Lawfully begotten of body
for ever and for want of such Heirs to fall to those that are

I Give and Bequeath unto my dear and well beloved Daughter
Ellen Rogers McFarland a Little Negro Girl Named Liddy a
Mare and Saddle and Bridle and Feather bed and furniture
I say to her and her Heirs Lawfully of her body and for want
of such Heirs to fall to those that are I Give and Bequeath
unto my son Robert McFarland a Lad Named Will and one Francis
Rounds if the money is as small a Value as it is now at this Present time
and my Desire is that John Rounds and my Daughter Martha Rounds
Should keep and take care of my son Robert and what Belongs to him
and I Give whatever I have got my son Robert to my Daughter
Martha Rounds after his Death to her Heirs forever

If my Negro Woman Sam has any more Children the first born
I leave to my Daughter Martha Rounds and her Heirs forever

I Give and Leave unto my dear and well beloved wife Margaret
the McFarland the whole Amount of my Estate Land and Negroes houses
hold Goods and furniture During her Natural Life if she continues
a Widow but if she Marries then the whole of my estate that I have not
already Bequeathed to be Equally Divided amongst my children
and likewise I Give and leave my Negro Man Will and my Negro Woman
Sara to my wife to Maintain her and her small Children During
as above said

Lastly I do Declare and Appoint Margaret McFarland my
Dear and well beloved wife and John my son to be whole and sole
Executors of this my Last will and Testament Discharging

Having Viewed all wills and Testaments by me made this only to be my
