I Give and Bequeath to my Wife Anne Ray all my Estate During her Widowhood and Remaining Single to Dispose and Dispose to each one of my Children as they stand in need or come of Age to be Equalized to my Daughter Susannah Ray to the Price of One thousand half and bid if it can be Shared if not every thing to be Equally divided at my wife's Death if remaining Single, and I do appoint my Wife Anne Ray & James Ray, William Ray Executors of this my last Will and Testament to sign up whereof I have here unto set my hand & Seal the day and Date at New Bedford
