Indenture John Brunser to Rob^t. McCommals Junr

This Indenture, made this 11th day of January, one thousand seven hundred & twenty eight, Between John Frazer, Soldier in the 1st South Regiment of the Continental Service from the North Carolina State, for the one part, Witnesseth that the said John Frazer doth bind his daughter Anne Frazer to Robert McPinnacles and his Spouse Martha McPinnacles, from the above date to the year of Christ one thousand seven hundred & thirty nine, to which the said McPinnacles & his Spouse promise to have her to be a Spinster & Maidservant and also for their part do promise to provide the said Anne Frazer with Bread & washing in like manner as they do their own children, as witness my hand this day & date written.

Indenture, Robert Smith to William

This Indenture made the fifth day of March in the year
of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & Seventy eight Between James
London City, Merchant of the City of London and Sir John & Charles
of the County of Lancashire and Province of York in the County of the Justices

State & delivered
in presence of
A. L. L. M.

of the said County, and their Successors, of the one part, and William
Horne of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said James Sanderson,
in pursuance to an Order of the said Court, made the ninth
day of December 1771. and according to the directions of the said
Assembly in that case made & provided, doth, put, place & bind,
with the said William Horne; Robert Smith an Orphan of the
age of Seventeen years last Christmas, with the said William Horne
to live after the manner of an Apprentice and Servant, until the
said Apprentice shall attain to the age of Twenty one years; during
all which time the said Apprentice, his said Master faith-
fully shall serve, his lawful Commands every where gladly
obey, he shall not at any time, absent himself from his said
Master's Service, without leave, but in all things act good and
faithfull Servant shall be have towards his said Master.

And he said William Glenn doth for want of promise & agree-
ment with the said Robert Smith that he will teach & instruct
in candlestick tawling & instructed the said Robert Smith to learn
the art of a wheelwright, and that he will constantly find provision
for the said Apprentice, during the Term aforesaid, sufficient Diet,
Washing, lodging & apparel fitting for an Apprentice & also all other
things necessary both in sickness and in health. In Witness whereof
the Parties to these presents, have interchangeably set their hands &
Seals the day & year first above written.
