First, being sorry from the Bottom of my heart for my Past
Sins and humbly begs forgiveness, for the same I Give and Commend
my soul to Almighty God my Creator & Redeemer, and my
Body to be Buried in such Place as my Executors shall appoint,

And now for the Settling of my Temporal Estate and such Goods
Chattels as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I do order
Give and Bestow, in the following manner: That is to say first
Will to my son Francis and my Daughter Ann all my Goods &
Chattels that on Clinch, to be Equally Divided Between them

and after my Just debts being payed, here I Bequeath to
my loving Wife all my Land, Goods and Chattels, during her
Life or Widowhood & then to be Disposed of as follows, To wit,
To my son John half a Dollar, To my son William half a Dollar
To my son Thomas Three Hundred Acres of Land up the
River to be made to him when of age, To my Daughter Mary Three half

a Dollar all my other Land, Goods & Chattels to be Divided equally
Between Catharine, Nathan, Fanny, Elizabeth, Susanah, At my
Wife and son Thomas's Discretion, I Witness with my hand
houshold at my hand & Seal the day & year above Written
