Chattel that are to be Equally Divided Between them
and after my Just Debts being payed, here I Bequeath to
my loving Wife all my Land, Goods and Chattels during her
life or Widewhood & then to be Disposed of as follows: To Will,
To my son John half a Dollar, To my son William half a Dollar
To my son Thomas Three Hundred acres of Land up the
to be made to him when of age, To my daughter Mary One half
a Dollar all my other lands, Goods & Chattels to be Divided equally
Between Catharine, Nathan, Fanny, Elizabeth & Susannah, At my
Wife and son Thomas's Discretion, With which I have
