and eighty nine, I Wm. Tate in the County of Surry,
in the State of North Carolina not being in Perfect Health
but sound in memory, do make this my last Will and Testament
Viz. First and principally I Commend my soul to God who
gives it hoping for Remission of all my sins Through the
Merits and Mediation of his ever blessed son Jesus Christ
our Lord, and my body to the Earth from whence it was
taken to be decently Interred at the discretion of my Executors
Hereafter Named, And as Touching such Temporal Estate
as it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I Give and
bestow as follows - Item I Give unto my beloved wife
(I give all my estate both real and Personal for the purpose
of raising and Educating my Children suitable to their
Circumstances to have hold Possess and Enjoy during her
Natural life or Widowhood and after the Decease of my
said Wife my Will is that the whole of my Estate both
Real and Personal be equally divided amongst my said
Children, and in case one or more of my said Children
should die before they come of age or Marry, the
Survivor of the rest shall divide their Parts, and further
it is my Will that a Negro Person named Abram be sold
be sold and the Money arising therefrom be put to the Use
that my Executors think best)

Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife beloved wife
Ann my Friend Tyne Harp and my son William when
he arrives to seventeen years old Executors & Executors
of this my last Will and Testament hereby resolving it
After Will or Wills hereof made by me I will not have

my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
Once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and
Testament, that is to say, Principally and first of all
I Give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I commend to the
Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at
the Great Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty power of God and as Touching such
Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me
in this life, I Give Devise and Dispose of the same
in the following manner Viz.

First I Give and bequeath to Nathaniel Swallow the
young son of my Daughter Mary Swallow the wife of John
Swallow one Shilling Sterling; Likewise I bequeath to be be-
cramped my Daughter the wife of John Crampford one
Shilling Sterling I also bequeath to my Daughter
Lucky Allison the wife of Archibald Allison one shilling
Sterling and I likewise bequeath to my son Thomas
Hamphris Green and my Daughter Ann

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Shadrach Greene whom I likewise Constituted make and
 Choose as my Heir to have all my Goods and Property
 to be Equally Divided between them at my Decease and
 I Will that my son Thomas Humphreys Greene May be
 bound to a House Squire at the Election of the County
 Court where he may reside at my Decease and the
 Person whom the Court shall think fit he may be
 bound to be his Guardian and that my son may have
 my Carpenter Tools And I do Will hereby Disallow
 Crocke and Deionall all and every Other former Testaments
 Wills Before Named and Confirming this and no Other to
 be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
