Last Will and Testament according to all Others by me
formerly made either by word or Writing
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Loving wife Elisabeth
Williamson the use of Two Negroes Richard & Lettice
during her Life or Widowhood likewise and the Estate
and after her Death to be equally Divided amongst her
Love Children now living with her
Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Williamson
Henry & Williamson Mary Williamson Lucy Williamson
and Martha Williamson an equal portion of all
my & Movable Property and what money I have due me
Leaving my main Seat of Land to be sold for Hundred
Pounds of Law opening it out of which money I Give my
two above mentioned sons Ten Hundred Pounds Apiece
Likewise I Give my son Benjamin Williamson my
bed and furniture one Walnut Desk one Chest one
Cupboard Standing in my room. If any of my above
mentioned Children should Die under Age without
Issue their Estate to be equally Divided among their
Living Brothers & Sisters Item I Give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Nancy Harrison one Horse of
Twenty Pounds Value and one Shilling Sterling
Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elisabeth
the use of Samuel a Negro Male Negroes Leah
Isaac & Lettice and one Shilling Sterling the Stock of Cattle
that I bought of Richard Moore to be Equally Divided
and one half to be converted to the use of Samuel Moore
Lastly I do nominate and appoint my two sons Benjamin
Williamson & Henry & Williamson Executors of this my Last Will

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and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & Seal this 13th day of March in the year of
our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Seven
