in hand, Paid by Robert Donaldson of the County Estate
Stokes, at and before the Sealing and Delivering of these
Present, And when with these I myself to be fully satisfied
and Paid have bargained Hold and by these Presents
do fully Clearly and Absolutely, Bargain & Hold unto the
Said Robert Donaldson, one feather Bed, and boutster
and one black Horse about four feet four or five inches high
The brand not Remembred, To have and to hold the said
Bed and Horse to the Said Robert Donaldson his Executors
and assigns. And the said Savannah Stokes my Executrix
or Adm^r do and Shall will and Truly pay or cause to be
paid to the Said Robert Donaldson his Exec^t Adm^r or assigns
The sum of one Thousand weight of Tobacco delivered at
Halifax at or upon the 27th day of November 1781. That
then this Present Bed and bargain and sale of the said
Bed and horse shall be utterly void and of none Effect or else
remain in full force and virtue as witness my hand this
26th day of November one Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty

 Between James Sanders Esq^r on behalf of himself & his wife the Inteior
 Count of the County of Craven & their Successors of the One Part
 & William Huston of the Other Part witnesseth that the said
 James Sanders Esq^r in Pursuance to an Act of the said
 County Court made the 3rd day of March 1783 and according
 to the Directions of our Hon^r Assembly in that case made
 & provided doth Put affee and bind unto the said William
 Huston, Anderson Haralson an Officer free of the age of
 Seven years & Two Months with the said William Huston to live
 after the Manner of an Apprentice Servant until he attain
 the age of Twenty one years during which time his said
 Master he faithfully shall serve his Lawfull Commandes every
 which party thereto shall not at any time absent himself
 from his said Master Service without leave in all things
 as good and faithfully behave towards his said Master
 And the said William Huston with Covenant promises
 to agree to and with the said James Sanders that he will
 work and labour to be taught and Instructed by the said Anderson
 Haralson to Read Writ & Copy her according to Law & also
 Instruct him in the Business of a Planter and that he will
 constantly tend & Provide for the said Apprentice sufficient
 and Necessary Lodging and apparel during the Term aforesaid
 getting for an Apprentice and also all other things necessary
 both in respect of his Health & Witness whereof the
 Parties to these presents hath Interchangeable set their
 hands & seals the day & year first above written
