lyeth on the East side of Storrs creek also one ^{Traded} bed & furniture
And it is my Will and Pleasure that what Goods chattels and
Stock shall be left after my said Wife's Decease or Marriage
(and after my legal Debts and the above bequeaths are)
Discharged shall be Equally Divided amongst my three
youngest sons Isaac, Jacob & Josiah

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Katherine
Fuller Executor and my son George Fuller Executor of this
my last Will and Testament and as hereby attested
Protest and disavow all and every Other former
Testaments, Will, Legacies bequeaths and Executors, by or
in any wise before named, Made and Bequeathed Relieving
and conforming this and no Other to be my last Will and
Testament In Witness whereof, I have set my hand &

shall be sold and my Just Debts paid with the money arising by
such sale and the Balance if any to be equally divided between
my two Daughters Mary, Fugate and Magdalena Harrison to
them and their heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath all my Lands and Tenements contained in
an Old Map Entered in Land Granter's Office and conveyed by
John Lea with all the Benefits of the Outings of Land made in
the County of Caswell Contained in the bounds of the said Map before
mentioned Except such parcels as I have sold and received payment
or bonds for the payment thereof Viz^t To James Sanders Esquire
two Hundred Acres lying on Mayo's Old Line. To William
Stephens Three Hundred Sixty four Acres lying on the head waters
of Little creek Sarvey's Bay Alexander Hapalson
To Thomas Jefferys a certain Quantity lying on Braselton's
his own & the waters of Little creek. Also an Entry of one
Hundred & Twenty Acres Transferred to William Stephens in Order
that out of that Land he may be enabled to make a deed
of Conveyance to Jefferys as he shall see cause for the
Performance thereof. Which said Land I have divided
Except such as has been excepted may be laid off in two
Equal parts according to the said Map which Lands as
divided, I desire that it may be divided in two equal parts
which I give unto my two Daughters Mary, Fugate & Magdalena
of John Fugate and Magdalena & William to them and
