Likewise to my well and well beloved son Francis Smith, four Guineas in money, a Coat and Jacket with Silver, and a new pair of Breeches, and one big Barrow, and a Bed Lamb. Likewise I give to my well beloved and second daughter Catharine Smith four head of Cattle, a Bed and Lamb, a Bed and wheel, and four Guineas in money, and a horn; Likewise I give to my second and well beloved son George Smith, two cows, a Cattle and Lamb, a big

Bar.

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Barrow, Cogg, and two Guineas in money, his horse and saddle a new Coat, and Blue Jacket, and Breeches, and a Brown big Coat. Likewise I give to my third and well beloved son Robert Smith ten Guineas in Money, the Plantation and Furniture belonging to it at present, and a Mare, and saddle, and a heifer, a yearling Steer and a yearling Bull, and two cows and Lamb, a Blue Coat and a new Jacket, and a Surtout. Likewise I give to my third and well beloved daughter Ruth Smith, three head of Cattle, a Bed and Lamb, a yearling Mare Cote, and four Guineas in Money, or Bed and her wheel. And I do hereby utterly disavow Reuben and Deborah, all and every other former Testament, Will and Devise, Bequest and Disposal by me in any ways before this time made, written and Recorded, Ratifying, and confirming this and so that to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal, And I do allow my wife Jane Smith, and my son Francis Smith, to be my Executors.

In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Kimbrough of the County of Prince Georges State of South Carolina being Sick and weak, in Body, but of sound mind, memory and understanding, do make and Publish this my

Last Will and Testament, in manner and form following:
 First of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it, trusting
 that ~~the~~ the same will receive happiness in the world to come
 through the merits of our Redeemer Jesus Christ; and my body
 to be buried in a Christian like manner, at the discretion of my
 Executors; And as to my Real Estate, with which it has pleased
 Almighty God to bless me in this life, I dispose of the same in
 the following manner, to wit, I Imprimis I lend to my
 beloved Wife Elkanah, during her natural life my Plantation
 whereon I now live, together with the following Negroes to wit,
 Sam George, Kate, King & Phoebe, also all my Household Furni-
 ture, Working Tools, one Horse called Speed, and three called Buggy
 one mare called Tip, eight Cows and Calves, four Pigs and Swine
 three Hens and Pigeons, and such out of my stock to support her &
 the above mentioned Negroes, and her; And after the decease of my
 said Wife I Will that the Plantation and land belonging thereto
 above mentioned, be sold by my Executors, hereafter named, or the sur-
 vivor of them, and the money arising from such sale to be equally
 divided between my sons John, William, Robert, Thomas, and my
 daughter Susan Reed, to them their heirs and assigns forever.
 And it is likewise my Will, after the decease of my said Wife, that
 the Negroes hereby lent to my Wife, and their Increase of any
 kind, and one Child hereafter to be born to my son Robert and his children,
 together with all the Furniture working Tools and stock which may
 then remain belonging to my Estate, be equally divided between

Son, John, William, Thomas, Robert, and my Daughter Susan, and
 to them their heirs and assigns forever; But in case my son Thomas
 should die without any issue, lawfully begotten of his Body, then
 my Will is that, all such Estate which is or may be devised to
 him, in this Will, be equally divided amongst my several
 Children above mentioned, to them their heirs and assigns forever.
 I hereby empower my said Executors to sell the above mentioned
 land and manse, and furnish them in their stead, if necessary or
 required by my said wife. Item, I give to my son John, one
 hundred and eight Acres of land be the same more or less, Beginning
 at a Birch on the North side of the South fork of Springline Creek
 running thence East 110 Poles to a Black Oak, thence South 15 Poles
 to a Poplar, thence West 110 Poles to a White oak, thence North 13 Poles
 to the beginning; also one Negro boy called Brittain to him his heirs
 and assigns forever; and it is my Will that he be paid the sum of £100
 three hundred & 10 Pounds and eight Pence, money out of my
 Estate which I justly owe to him. Item, I give to my son Robert
 one hundred and thirty Acres of land be the same more or less, Beginning at a
 Birch, to him his heirs forever, running thence East 110 Poles to a Black
 Oak, thence North 100 Poles to a Black Oak, thence West to the last branch
 thence down the bank to the creek, thence up the meadows of the creek
 to the first station; also one Negro girl, called Jenny to him his
 heirs and assigns forever. Item, I give to my son William one hundred
 and eighty Acres of land be the same more or less, Beginning at a
 Birch, to him his heirs forever. Item, I give to my son Thomas one
 hundred and eighty Acres of land be the same more or less, Beginning at a
 Birch, to him his heirs forever. Item, I give to my son Robert one hundred
 and eighty Acres of land be the same more or less, Beginning at a
 Birch, to him his heirs forever.

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Let one Negro Woman called Lydia, and the first child which may be born of any of the Negroes lent to my wife which may live to be 14 years months old, and after the decease of my said son Robert, that the said two Negroes Lydia and the child, together with their increase be equally divided amongst my said ^{son} Robert's children.

Item, I Will that the Trust of Land whereon my son Robert now lives may be sold at the expense of my Estate, and that my Executors furnish my said son Robert with money sufficient for that purpose when in the Land Office shall be shown. And it is further my Will that the said tract of land be divided as follows to wit, that Twenty five Acres adjoining my son Thomas's land on the North side, be laid off and returned to me said son Thomas his heirs and assigns forever. That the remainder in my tract be divided by Michael Bernick, that the land on the South side, be belong to my son Robert, and that on the North side, be belong to my son James to them their heirs assigns forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Sarah Brown, one Negro Boy called Ben, with his hands Freed money, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Mary Brown, one Negro Boy called Ben, with his hands Freed money, and all the said household furniture now in possession of her & her husband, for which I have a Will of sale.

Item, I give to my daughter Betty Brown, one Negro Girl called Lorraine now in her possession, also the sum of Ten pounds Freed money, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Item.

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Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Turner one Negro Boy called Sam, with his hands Freed money, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Lachy Turner one Negro Girl, called Rachel with hands Freed money, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give to my Daughter Fanny Cannon during her natural life, one Negro Girl called Agg which she has now in her possession and one Negro Boy called Darry and after her decease I will that the said Negro Girl Agg and her increase, and the said Negro Boy Darry be equally divided amongst the children of my said Daughter Fanny Cannon to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give for the support and maintenance of my son James one Negro Boy called David and one hundred pounds Freed money to be placed in the hands of my son John, which said Negro and money after the decease of my son James I will to my said son John, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item, I give to my sons John, William and Thomas, all that shall be due to me for my wife's legacy, in Parton, from the Estate of my said wife devised to her Thomas Brown, to be equally divided amongst them.

Item, I Will that the remainder part of my Negroes and stock which is not given and devised in this Will, be sold by my Executors and the money arising from said sale be applied towards paying of the several legacies, and other purposes given by this Will.

And lastly, I do nominate constitute and appoint my sons John and William, whole and sole Executors of this my last Will

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and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all other former Will and Wills by me made, I do hereby declare that I have hereunto set my hand and seal at the 26th day of Sep^r.
