Thomas Rice in pursuance to an Order of the said Court made
the day and date above written and according to the direction
of the Gen^l Assembly in that case made do hereby do hereby
put place and bind unto the said Edward V. Neill, Thomas
Sutton an Appren^t now of the age of Two years last August
with the said Edward V. Neill to live after the manner of an
Apprent^d Servant until he shall attain to the age of Twenty
One years during all which time the said Appren^t his said
Master faithfully shall serve his Lawfull Commands every
where Gladly Obey he shall not at any time Absent
himself from his said Master's service without leave but in
all things as a Good and faithful Servant shall behave
Towards his said Master And the said Edward V. Neill
doth Covenant Promise and Agree to and with the said
Thomas Rice that he will Teach and Instruct and cause to
be taught and Instructed the said Thomas Sutton reading
to read Right W^{ts} also the Art and Mystery of
a Planter and that he will Constantly feed and provide for
the said Appren^t during the Term aforesaid sufficient

The Condition of this Obligation is such that Whereas the above bounden Thomas Brooks is by law appointed Treasurer for the County of Caswell & Therefore the said Thomas Brooks shall well and truly account for and pay unto the Treasurer of the State aforesaid in such Public Taxes as shall be Collected from the Inhabitants of the County of Caswell for the year 1790. at such times and in such manner as the Law Directs also such Other Sums as are Collected and paid him according to Law, after deducting such Lawful Commissions therefrom and such Indemnity as shall be allowed by the Court of the County aforesaid then the above Obligation shall be void Otherwise to remain in full force & Effect.
