Name for the recovery thereof and upon the receipt of any such debts
sums or sums of Money aforesaid Receipts or other sufficient
Discharges for me and in my Name to Make Sale and Deliver and
Gratiously sell and convey other debt or thing and things move or
Immove in the Law whatsoever, Needfull and Necessary to be
done in and about the Premises for me and in my Name to do
act and perform as fully largely and amply to all intents and
Purposes as I myself might or could do if I was personally present
or as if the Matter required more special Authority than is herein
given Attorneys are for more under for the Purposes aforesaid
to make & constitute and again at Pleasure to revoke Repealing
Altering and holding firm and Effectual all and whatsoever
my said Attorney shall lawfully do in and about the Premises
