Know all persons whom it may concern that William Chambers of Carroll County State of North Carolina for and in Consideration of the sum of Forty eight pounds two shillings lawful money of his State to me in hand paid by Will. Ervine of the County of the County State of North Carolina the receipt Whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold & delivered and do hereby sell and deliver unto the said William Ervine a certain Negro Wench by name of Dinah about sixteen years of age To Have and to hold the said Bargained promises unto the said William Ervine his Executors Administrators and Assigns forever and I the said William Chambers for myself my Executors and Administrators the said Bargained promises unto the said William Ervine his Executors Administrators and Assigns against all persons shall and will warrant to be our defend by these presents (Provided Robert the 1st of the said William Chambers his Ex^{or} & Adm^r & Assigns or either of them do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto said William Ervine his Ex^{or} & Adm^r & Assigns the sum of Forty eight pounds two shillings as principal and interest lawful money of this State on the 1st day of October in the year 1791 in Redemption of the said bargained Negro. Then the present Bill of sale to be void and of none effect but in Default hereof in the payment of the said Forty eight pounds two shillings contrary to the manner and form aforesaid that then it shall remain and be in full force & Virtue In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of October 1790
